Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the subject cited above and to convey that the Commission has decided to give away the following Awards:-

Best Electoral Practice Award A.

- The General Category Award shall be presented to the best performing District Election Officers (DEOs)/Superintendents of police (SPs) in the area of election management. The Award would carry a cash prize along with a plaque and a citation.
- Special Award(s) will be presented to officers, other than DEO/SP, who have made significant contribution to conduct of elections, covering areas like Expenditure Control, SVEEP, Technology, Security, Infrastructure, Electoral Roll management and innovative measures etc. The awards would carry a cash prize along with a plaque and a citation.
- Best State Award would be given to the State displaying best overall performance in various areas of election management. The Award would carry a cash prize along with a plaque and a citation and would be received by the Chief Electoral Officer of the State/UT.
- National CSO Award for the best campaign on voter education and awareness National Award for the CSO is to be given away to institutions, Organizations or Individuals for promoting electoral participation through effective and innovative programmes or projects. The Award would carry a plaque and a citation. The scheme and criteria of the Award is enclosed.
- National Award for Govt. Department/Agency/PSU for enhancing electoral C. National Award for Govt. Department/Agency is to be given away for enhancing electoral participation. The Award would carry a plaque and a citation. The scheme and criteria of the Award is enclosed.

D. Annual State Awards for Best Electoral Practices

Annual State awards for Best Electoral Practices was instituted in 2014 to recognize the efforts and contribution of the Officers, and to commend and encourage individual and team accomplishments in diverse fields of election management. The guidelines and framework for this award remain the same as conveyed vide Commission's letter No. 491/SVEEP/42/2014 dated 24th December, 2014 (copy enclosed).

- 2. Nominations: The CEOs shall send the nominations with recommendations for Awards in the enclosed format along with enclosures. The nominations shall be as follows:
- 2.1 For General Category Award, CEOs shall nominate officers based on outstanding performance in election management in any one of the following:
 - i) Voter's Education and Electoral Participation
 - ii) Management of Electoral Rolls
 - iii) Expenditure Monitoring & Tackling Money Power
 - iv) Use of Technology
 - v) Security Management
 - vi) Infrastructure Management
 - vii) Innovative measures
- 2.1.1 There may be upto 4 nominations (3DEOs +1SP) from States with more than 300ACs, upto 3 nominations (2 DEOs+ 1SP) from States between 200-300 ACs, upto 2 nominations (1 DEO + 1 SP) each from States /UTs with less than 200 ACs.
- 2.2 For **Special Award**, CEOs may nominate officers other than DEOs covering areas like Expenditure Control , SVEEP, Technology, Security, Infrastructure, Electoral Roll management and innovative measures, etc. from among all officers/staff of all categories (including those from CEOs office).
- 2.2.1 For the special award, 3 officers may be nominated from States with more than 300 ACs, 2 from States between 200-300 ACs, 1 from States less than 200 ACs

- 2.3 **Best State Award** may be given to the State displaying best overall performance in all the following areas:
 - i. Overall conduct of elections
 - ii. Voter's Education and Electoral Participation
 - iii. Management of Electoral Rolls
 - iv. Expenditure Monitoring & Tackling Money Power
 - v. Use of Technology
 - vi. Security Management
 - vii. Infrastructure Management
 - viii. SVEEP
 - ix. Innovative measures

- For National CSO Award and National Award for Govt. Deptt./Agency/PSU, CEOs may ensure that the entries are in prescribed format and duly recommended by the Chief Electoral Officer.
- 3. Selection: The selection Committee may decide the winners in the following manner:
- 3.1 The nominations for the Best Electoral Practices award (General Award and Special Award) may be scrutinized and names shortlisted. The shortlisted candidates may be required to give a presentation to the committee. The selected candidates may be recommended to Commission for the Awards. Commission may, if it so wishes, review the presentations.
- 3.2 For the Best State Award, the committee may select the winner based on various performance indicators and recommend to Commission.

Commission may, if it so wishes, ask for a presentations. The indicators (not exhaustive) for assessing the performance of the state shall be as follows:

- (i) Increase in the EP Ratio
- (ii) Increase in Gender ratio on rolls
- (iii) Increase in 18-19 yrs registration
- (iv) Increase in registration of PwD, NRI excluded class, etc.
- (v) EPIC/PER Coverage, EPIC distributed in NVD
- (vi) Partnership building
- (vii) Conduct of Elections-peaceful and incident free polls
- (viii) Voter turnout -Overall and in low turnout and vulnerable PS
- (ix) Voter Turnout meeting gaps in gender, urban and youth participation
- (x) Innovation in process/procedure
- (xi) Innovation in the use of technology
- (xii) Additional indicators (may be stated)
- 3.3 For the National CSO Award and National Award for Govt. Deptt/Agencies shortlisted agencies may be invited for giving presentation to the Committee.

4. Last date

- 4.1 The nominations in the prescribed format, for the Best Electoral Practices Awards, National CSO award and National Award for Govt. Department/Agency may be sent to the Commission latest by 10th November, 2017.
- 4.2 For the Annual State Awards, the names of selected Award winners may be sent to Commission for approval latest by 5th January, 2018.

The Awards shall be given on National Voters' Day, those at A, B, & C at the National function of NVD in New Delhi and those at 'D' at the state function of NVD.



State/UT Awards for Best Electoral practices

(Framework)

Annual State awards for Best Electoral Practices shall be instituted by all States/UTs from 2014to recognize the efforts and contribution of the Officers, and to communed and encourage individual and team accomplishments in diverse fields of election management. The broad framework of the awards is as follows:

1. STATE AWARDS

- 1.1 The Awards shall be presented to be performing District Election Officers (DEOs) (other than National Award winners), ERO/Aero and BLO of the State. The awards may carry cash component. The awards would be given to the officials who have done exceptional innovative work in election management.
- 1.2 Special Award will be presented to officers who have made significant contribution to conduct of elections, covering all areas like SVEEP, Expenditure control, Technology, Security, Polling Station management etc. from among all officers/staff of all categories outside those mentioned at 1.1. This may also carry cash component.
- 1.3 The Officers winning the National Award may not be given the State Award. However the National Award winners from the state shall be mentioned at the State level function (NVD) though they are not given any award there. (The names of Nation Award winners shall be intimated before 30th December)

3. UNION TERRITORIES AWARDS

3.1. The criteria for the Awards shall be similar to that in State except that the Best DEO Award shall be replaced with "Best Electoral Practice Award" and to be given to either a DEO or an ERO.

4. OTHER AWARDS

The State may also institute Awards to recognize the contribution from Campus Ambassadors, Village Awareness Groups (formed under directions from EEM), Civil Society and Media for their contribution to the electoral process. These Awards may be instituted on need basis and wherever the contribution from this category of partners have been worthy of recognition and acknowledgement.

5. SELECTION

- 5.1. A Committee at State/UT Level may be constituted to scrutinize the nominations and shortlist the winners. The constitution of the Committee may be sent to the Commission for approval.
- 5.2. All officers <u>nominated</u> by the CEO for the National Award may automatically be included for the State Award for consideration of the State Committee. In addition, more entries may be invited.



- DEOs may submit their nominations to the CEO for Best DEO Awards. 5.3.
- The nominations for remaining Awards, including those instituted under sl no 5.4. '4' may be forwarded by DEOs to the CEO.
- The selected names shall be recommended to the Commission for approval. 5.5. 5.6.
- The awards shall be given away on National Voters Day at State/UT HQs.
- Detailed guidelines on the selection and nomination may be chalked out by 5.7. the CEO within this broad framework and communicated to the Commission.

6. FUNDING

The funds for the Award for 2017 shall be met from the State funds (under Elections/ER) and no separate budget shall be provided by ECI for the same.

7. Timeline

The names of selected Award Winners should be sent to Commission for approval latest by 5th January, 2018.
